

We call the duties we perform every day the AM and PM routines. Kind of funny because most routines at the B&B are anything but. Mornings we set out to feed our little guests, scoop their litter, and straighten and clean their rooms. Beyond that, the cats put their own twist on things.

Doing just as Mom and Dad do at home, our kitty catering may call for adding water to food, mixing foods, cutting up bits of turkey or cheese, and giving kitty yogurt, milk or other items (like ice cream and whipped cream!).

Some cats require medicine, but we make it clear that we are not vets. As best we can, we provide the meds our guests get at home. We usually manage to get pills and drops where they're supposed to go.

When Colette rescued a mother cat and two kittens in 2001, little did she know what was ahead. She found good homes for mom and one kitten. As she cradled the remaining scrawny kitten "I knew I was destined to love and care for him. Thus began my life with 'Peanut'."

Rambunctious **Peanut** broke glassware, dove through the swinging lid of the kitchen waste basket, and body slammed Mom's bedroom door till she let him in. When a boyfriend proved allergic to cats, guess who stayed?

For years, **Peanut** enjoyed a healthy life but when his weight climbed for no apparent cause, nothing his vet suggested could get it down. When she needed to board her cats, Colette placed them at a veterinary clinic. "They did an excellent job, but I couldn't wait to return and bring them home". Colette found *The* Country Kitty B & B online, paid us a visit, and explained her kitty's special needs. **Peanut** stayed with us in February and was quite the loveable character. What he lacked physically, he made up for in determination.

When he arrived at the *B* & *B* for another stav in June, **Peanut** was noticeably weaker. During one of her occasional visits, Peanut's holistic vet confirmed that he was failing.

Lynn, Jean and I agreed to do everything we could to keep Peanut going till Colette's return. While Jean and Kip mostly cared for our other guests, Lynn dedicated herself to medicinal requirements. It was difficult and intimidating. At times we cried, but Peanut's stiff upper lip and unfailing "attitude" kept us focused.

Phone calls and email kept us in touch with Colette. Two days before her return, she got the sad news from us and the vet that **Peanut** was slowly shutting down. Once home, Colette hurried to the *B* & *B*. She later told us, "I was always terrified of this moment, of making that decision. I thought **Peanut** would bounce back again as he did so many times in the past. We had fought so hard together." But there was no debating Peanut was now suffering. It was time. Colette tearfully held **Peanut** in her arms while waiting for the vet to arrive at the *B*&*B*. Soon his battle was over.

Colette recently wrote to tell us, "All who knew him would agree **Peanut** was a celebrity, a character who made a lasting impression. Losing my little boy was devastating, but I am sure that we will be together again for all eternity."
