

Although a litter box is something one could take for granted if they have a cat, the cats who stay at the *B*&*B* often train us about their preferences. Some cats like to mound their litter in the center of the box. Should we forget and smooth over the litter after we scoop it, they'll promptly step in and re-mound it. Noah wants his litter mounded to the left side of his box. There are cats who compartmentalize their litter, doing their business only in certain areas. Some will spend a long time making sure everything is covered, while others just walk away when finished! There are neat cats who somehow never leave a drop of litter on the floor, while others kick and toss it everywhere, as well as track it all over their bedding.

Sweeping Us Off Our Feet Part of our daily routine is sweeping the floors in our cat rooms. While most cats just watch us or try to grab the broom, we have some cats we call "weavers". Cricket. Elsa, Diamond, and Tessie just love to "help" us by weaving around our feet as we try to walk about the room sweeping. Throughout this process, we have to be "on our toes" watching to see just where they are so we don't trip over them, which could prove to be a disaster for both human and cat. Occasionally, we'll ask someone to sit and entertain the kitty so we can finish our task, but even that doesn't always work. Once our housekeeping efforts are done, it's naptime so they can rest and be ready for the next big sweep.

Kindred Spirits

One day, a very nice gentleman called about boarding his two male cats, Smokey and Spooky. He was very concerned about how they would do since **Smokey** was docile, and **Spooky** could be a little assertive. Spooky was also afraid of strangers and would need a space to hide. rimmed. For one or two cats who like to eat our corn-based litter, we offer a different brand. Some cats might miss their box, so we have towels and puppy pads to set under the box. We might start with one type of box and find we have to try something different.

A vital part of litter box care is monitoring the contents. If a cat goes outdoors, the owner might not be aware of how many times a cat urinates. We try to count the clumps of litter we scoop and note it on their daily chart. We also observe their stools, chart it and note if we feel there is a problem. The litter box can also reveal health concerns that we share with the owner when they pick up their cat.

Most cats are happy to be by our side when we scoop out their box. We praise them, and they seem very proud of themselves. Typical cat!
